



CHAPERONES

There are two levels for chaperones: Assistant and Head. Chaperones generally ride the bus to and from the regattas and are provided a free hotel room for overnights. The chaperones help the coaches keep everything running smoothly. They oversee safety at roadside stops and food breaks; make sure no one is left behind; accompany the team when restaurants are part of the plan; sleep with one eye open in hotels and remind rowers to pick up their stuff. Usually the Head Chaperone has some experience but the Assistant Chaperones can sign up for on the job training. Many parents believe this is the most fun job of all.
